I had been invited by Sensei Philip Kalloo to travel to Trinidad and Tobago to give technical, coaching and referee seminars and to oversee the championship. On October 22nd I was on my way back home, flying to Miami on American Airlines flight #2282 when suddenly the cabin started filling up with smoke. There was a fire in the cockpit and one of our engines was leaking oil. It was announced that we were going to have an emergency landing in the water and everyone had to put on their life jackets. We had a rough landing and were met by countless fire trucks spraying water all over the plane while the flight attendants opened the exit doors to let out the smoke. During the 30 minutes of confusion and feeling helpless in the airplane I was thinking, "Life TRULY is a blessing and is priceless," as I always say in my classes and at testing. My message to everyone is to take the time to enjoy life, enjoy your siblings, appreciate what you have, hug your family and friends and say, "I love you." As we all say, "Life is short," and I learned that it could be a lot shorter than you think.

Finally, I would like to wish Mr. & Mrs. Gilca who are hosting the 7th Annual IMA Utah Championship on November 9th a successful tournament and the best of success to Kamran, Maya, and Kuba in Spain for the Jr. World Championships from November 7th – 10th.


Congratulations to Mr. Radu Gal!
